


- Created a 1-year apprenticeship program developing skills through instruction and on-the-job training.
- Implementing an AmeriCorps Seniors Workforce Development Program through a federal grant to employ Community Health Workers over age 55 in select counties throughout the state.
- Offering existing Community Health Workers an opportunity to upskill in serious illness care, hospice, palliative care, and grief support.

Collaborations and Partnerships

- Improve access and efficiency of hospice supporting the Illinois Hospice and Palliative Care Organization and Ohio Council of Home Care and Hospice.
- Assist with curriculum development and delivery for the Coleman Palliative Medicine Training Program in pediatric serious illness care and community health worker utilization and benefits.
- Research Opportunities:
 - Received \$6 MILLION from PCORI to study strategies to support parents after a child's unexpected or traumatic death through Missing Pieces in partnership with Ann & Robert H. Lurie's Children's Hospital of Chicago and University of Chicago.
 - Finalized a research project in partnership with NORC at the University of Chicago to better understand the knowledge, attitudes, and behaviors of Black communities in Chicago regarding serious illness care.
- Earned an appointment for a HAP team leader to the Illinois Department of Public Health's Community Health Worker Review Board.
- Promote education and awareness of advance care planning using the POLST form.
