Warriors Until the End: HAP offers Resources on Serious Illness and End-of-Life to Veterans in Peoria



On May 10, The HAP Foundation hosted Warriors Until the End at the Peoria Public Library. Some aging veterans have life-long chronic or acute serious illness diagnoses following their military service decades ago. This event explored the unique experiences and health concerns of veterans based on their era of service, discussed complex emotions and care navigation that can arise in end-of-life care of veterans, and explained what resources are available to help veterans and their family caregivers. Representatives from the Peoria Housing Authority, Greater Peoria Honor Flight, AmeriCorps Seniors Workforce Demonstration program, and Traditions Hospice presented during the event. AmeriCorps Seniors Workforce Demonstration Program in Peoria: Update



Last week, the AmeriCorps Seniors Workforce Demonstration volunteers in Peoria finished the classroom portion of their training after completing 40 hours of the Community Health Worker (CHW) core competency curriculum. These volunteers will continue their on-the-job training at the community-based organizations where they are already making significant impacts.

This senior workforce cohort developed a resource guide for this new volunteer position, and will continue their learning as a group that will meet monthly. The

core group will consist of AmeriCorps volunteers, and invitations will be extended to local CHWs, members of the police department, and other community-based organizations so everyone can remain informed about health resources and social support programs in the Peoria community.

One AmeriCorps Seniors volunteer shared that after completing the CHW training, they were able to see themselves, their family, and friends in a much better, positive way. The HAP Foundation is grateful for our 11 volunteers who have already made such a positive impact in their community

Each CHLC convening contains education programming to encourage, inform our work, and open dialogue about critical issues that impact our organizations.
